Warm-Up Discussion and Vocabulary

Task 2

The first __ *Thanksgiving* __ was in 1621 when the Plymouth colonists and Wampanoag Indians shared an autumn harvest feast together in present-day Massachusetts. While the holiday originally held religious significance, today the holiday centers on cooking a large __ *meal* __ and celebrating with __ *family and friends* __. The fourth Thursday of every November is a time when Americans get together to give thanks to the people and things they are __ *grateful* __ for. The Wednesday before Thanksgiving is the biggest __ *travel* __ day of the year in the country, as Americans drive and fly to go meet the family. There are parades, TV specials, and discount shopping associated with this holiday. The following Friday is called __ *“Black Friday”* __ – a day that shoppers line up early in the morning to get the best sales and discounts for their holiday shopping.

GRAMMAR REVIEW

Prepositions

Prepositions are one of the eight parts of speech in English. It shows the relationship between parts of a sentence. For example: “The turkey is ON the table.” The preposition “on” shows the relationship between the turkey and the table. The turkey could be under the table, beside the table, behind the table, in front of the table, and so on.

Prepositions tell us where the turkey is.

A **prepositional phrase** begins with a preposition and ends with a noun or pronoun. And a **prepositional phrase of place** includes a preposition to tell us where something is located.

Examples:

on the table**to** the kitchen**from** the refrigerator**in** their chairs**with** the gravy boat**beside** it**beside** the potatoes**down** the hallway
