Task 3

Listen to the audio and answer the questions.

- Where is Paul flying to?
Paul is flying to Berlin.
- Does he have luggage to check? What does the airline employee ask Paul to do with his bag?
Yes, Paul has luggage to check. The airline employee asks him to put his suitcase onto the scale.
- How much does his suitcase weigh? Does he have to pay an overweight baggage fee?
His suitcase weighs 24 pounds. He does not need to pay an overweight baggage fee.
